Enrolment

Owairoa Primary School is a Zone Free School. We welcome enrolment enquiries and feel privileged to have the opportunity to assist you in this very important decision on student enrolment.

Prior to your child's first day of school, we extend an invitation to you to meet with our Principal, who will introduce you to our fine educational facility, take you on a guided tour and will ensure any questions you may have are answered at this time. Following this meeting you will receive a 'Welcome to our School Pack' which will include all the documentation required for pre-enrolment.

Pre-school visits

Pre-school children are invited to visit the school prior to their actual starting day. This is most helpful in giving new students the opportunity to meet their teacher and the class. Two visits are recommended. The visiting times available are on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 9.30am to 10.30am. Starting School Parents Meeting

You will be notified by letter regarding a Starting School meeting for parents. This will be one or two months before your child starts school and should answer all your questions regarding your child's school life.

First Day

On your child's first day at Owairoa Primary School please report to the Office Manager at the Main School Office to complete the enrolment process.

School Contribution

The payment of an Annual School Contribution is appreciated by the Board of Trustees. These funds are targeted towards the purchase of resources such as library books, audio visual equipment, IT resources and sporting equipment. The contribution is also used to support our many Specialist Teachers.

Attendance

All students are legally required to attend school every day that school is in session, unless they are sick or absent for a legitimate reason.

The school has no authority to grant exemption from this requirement to attend lessons during school hours for outside school activities such as dance, drama, music, and remediation.

We would ask that such appointments, whenever possible, be made outside school hours.

The school also has no authority to grant permission for students to undertake vacations and family activities outside the school holiday.

The school is very mindful of student safety, welfare and protection and monitors student attendance seriously.

The following attendance protocol has been established.

- All absences relating to sickness or other reasons must be notified to the school office Ph 5380060, together with a reason for the absence. You can speak directly to an office person or leave a message on the Absence Hotline which operates 24/7. The absence must be followed up by a note to the class teacher on the student's return to school.
- 2. In cases where the child has an appointment eg Doctor, Dentist etc a note should be given

to the class teacher prior to, or on the day the leave is required.

3. All students attending such an appointment must be signed out and all students arriving late for school must be signed in, at the office.

Please understand these systems are put in place to protect your child. Your co-operation is essential.

Community

Board of Trustees [BOT]

The School is governed by a seven member Board of Trustees. The Board consists of five Elected Parents, the School Principal and a Staff Representative. Elections are held once every 3 years.

The Board holds monthly meetings in the school staffroom and parents and members of the wider community are welcome to attend. The dates of these meetings are advertised in the school newsletters and on the school website.

The minutes of each Board meeting are available to you, on request.

Parent Teacher Association [PTA]

The PTA is an important support group for the school. Their function is to provide support services for the many school activities and to fundraise for a myriad of extra school resources.

The new PTA is formed at its Annual Meeting held in March of each year. We welcome the support of parents at our school.

Te Whanau o Owairoa

This support group gives an opportunity to discuss school matters relating to Maori aspirations. It ensures that the Charter goals, in reference to the Treaty of Waitangi, are being supported strongly by our school whanau.

New Settlers Support Groups

In welcoming New Settler Parents to New Zealand and to our school we offer the support of first Language Speakers and meetings for different cultures eg Korean, Chinese and South African groups.

If you are not confident with English and you need help with translating school matters, please ask at the school office. We also invite New Settlers and visiting parents to our special Parent's Class, run daily from 9am to 10.40 am. This class focuses on oral discussion about doing things the "Kiwi" way.

Sporting opportunities

Students are encouraged to experience the many different sporting opportunities offered at our school.

All students have opportunities to participate in a wide rage of sporting activities in their regular Physical Education and Sporting programmes.

We are proud to offer a range of physical pursuits at different levels of the school.

These include cricket, softball, baseball, rugby, netball, soccer, hockey, basketball, athletics, cross country, orienteering, touch rugby, rugby league, swimming, and gymnastics. Owairoa is proud to have teams represent the school for various sporting competitions within the Eastern Zone.

Cultural opportunities

Cultural activities give the spirit to the school and the Music and Performing Arts are well supported at our school.

Every student attends our music class programme in our well equipped music suite. The students are encouraged to join our choirs, recorder groups, keyboard groups, cultural groups, dance troupes, drama groups and our orchestra. Students gain oratory skills and confidence through their participation in our speech and poetry recitation competitions each year.

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Before and After School Care

A Before and After School care facility is operated on the school site. Accent on Kidz provides a full service from 7.00 to 8.30am, 3.00 to 6.00pm, daily during school term and 7.30am to 5.30pm every school holidays. The facility also caters for family emergencies and parents who work rostered shifts.

Visitors to the School

The safety of our students and staff are of paramount importance to us.

As part of our Health and Safety procedures, all visitors to the school must report to the School Office upon their arrival at school.

All visitors are required to sign in and a Visitors Identification Badge is issued as required.

This procedure is not required for parents delivering and collecting students before and after school.



School Chaplain

Our school is very fortunate in having a School Chaplaincy Support service. The Chaplain's role is to be a caring, listening ear and someone who has the time to listen. The Chaplain is available to students, staff and families to support them in whatever way is helpful to them.

Seasons Programme

The Seasons Programme is a peer support programme for children between the ages of 5 to 12 who have gone through grief or loss such as the separation / divorce of parents or death of a significant person in their life. Each group will have children of a similar age that have experienced similar loss/losses.

The Seasons programme tries to provide some normalisation for the children. The group sessions offer this by way of peer support, and by showing that there are others who have gone through a similar loss and have all the different types of feelings that go along with it. The children form a bond and are able to talk, listen and provide different coping strategies for each other.

New Settler Student Support Programme

New Settler students have the opportunity to join a support programme which deals specifically with the feelings these children have when relocating to a new country and leaving their extended family.

Zero Tolerance of Bullying

We have a zero tolerance of bullying at Owairoa Primary School. We take seriously and will investigate any incident that is reported to us. We intend to eliminate these hurtful behaviours and request that you report any incident via email to bullying@ owairoa.school.nz or by phoning the school office on 538 0060.

Physical Education / Sports

Sports uniforms are compulsory for Year 2 to Year 6 students. Sports shoes are encouraged for all sporting activities.

Make Up

Students are not permitted to wear makeup of any kind to school.

Jewellery

For safety and security reasons jewellery is not permitted at school. A wristwatch is acceptable for boys and girls. If your child has their ears pierced, they may wear studs, but no protruding or hanging earrings. No other body piercing or hair dyeing is permitted.

Uniform Shop

The school Uniform Shop is open Monday to Friday 8.30 to 9.00am and 3.00 to 3.30pm. The Shop is situated in the foyer of the hall.

A fully updated contact list is required at all times for all students.

To allow us to have an accurate student data base, your cooperation is essential in updating the office every time that there is a change of address, phone or changes to family circumstances.


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
