

# **Building Strong Attendance Patterns**

If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss a whole year of school by 16 years of age. As a parent, you, alongside the school, play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance.

All students are legally required to attend school every day and it is a shared responsibility to make sure students attend and engage in learning from when they first start school. As we enter 2024, every day of school matters.

You must let the school know if your child is going to be absent for a day or intends to be absent from school eg. for a medical procedure. Family holidays or taking time off for non-medical reasons are not acceptable reasons for being absent.

If you're struggling at home with getting your child to school, please communicate with us. Our school is committed to supporting your child to attend school and building regular attendance patterns by having:

- School staff who have strong relationships with students and families.
- A school culture that recognises your child and your family for who they are, where they come from and who they want to be.
- A school community that does everything to make sure students are at school, and they are participating and progressing in their education.



We are looking forward to our annual Open Home event next week on Thursday 22nd February, where Parents are invited into school to meet the Teacher, understand the learning environment and hear about the new routines and expectations for your child for the year ahead.

Our Open Home will offer three sessions, to help fit into your busy schedule. No appointment is necessary.

- 3.15pm—4.00pm
- 4.15pm—5.00pm
- 5.15pm—6.00pm

The event gives the opportunity for the Teacher to introduce themselves to you, provide feedback on the start to the year, and to discuss things pertinent to their classroom.

At Owairoa Primary School we nurture relationships and we value connections, not just with our students, but with their families too. This Open Home opportunity will allow families to establish a connection with the teacher early in

the year, where you can talk about your goals for your child and set them up for a successful year.

One of the keys to the success of a child's education is the school and community working in partnership. Parents taking an active interest in their child's educational journey makes all the difference.


After the Open Home, parents wishing to communicate in more detail about any educational, health or wellbeing issue are welcome to set up a time to meet with the Teacher directly as needed.

The preliminary dates of the trials are below with which year groups can trial.



# **Road Safety**

Thank you to those parents who have set up good routines of dropping students off at school each morning, ready for a prompt start at 8.45am. Keeping our students safe around our school is always a priority for us, especially during daily drop-offs and pick-ups when traffic congestion is significant. Your support for mitigating risk around our school site is appreciated.



To ensure we keep all of our students safe, please slow down when passing the school, and be mindful and patient of cars around you.

The start of the year is always a timely reminder for Parents to practice good road safety etiquette:

- all students and parents need to cross the road using the pedestrian crossing
- please do not stop on the yellow lines to drop off or pick up your children
- avoid parking across driveways when dropping your child off or picking them up
- it is safest for your child to get out of the vehicle on the footpath side, not the roadside
- the official speed limit around schools is 40km from 8.20am 9am

Road rules around schools are designed are to keep our children, you and others protected. Please appreciate it is a community effort to help keep everyone safe.

It is important that we have up to date addresses, email addresses and mobile phone numbers at all times. # Early Signing Out of Students

- The law states that all school age students should attend school for the full hours every day that the school is officially open. In addition to the issues we are having with students late for school on a daily basis, a re-emerging trend is for parents signing students out early, especially on a Friday afternoon where Parents want to get away earlier for a weekend break to beat the traffic.
- Please remember the official school day finishes at 3pm every day. The only valid reason for an earlier sign out is for an appointment eg. Specialist, dental or not feeling well.


## **Health Matters**
